On 2-12-05 I was sent to 11 South Rd. to assist the medics on a report of a lady that received burns while cooking, that her night gown had caught fire. I was also informed the fire was out.

Upon my arrival I saw that a couple firemen were pulling up to the house along with the ambulance. As I walked up to the house I saw that smoke was heavy in the house, I entered to see fire men walking a elderly female, ( Atwilda Brown) into the living room area, and they were holding a house coat off her shoulder. I saw that Mrs. Brown had burns on her arm and shoulder and rib area. Medics and firemen attended to her care. I assisted the firemen with opening windows. I walked into a bedroom at the North end of the house and found a night gown on the floor sill smoldering, along with a burnt pair of socks and under ware. I had firemen hurry to my location with a water can to wet the area of the rug that the clothing was smoldering on. I saw that Mrs. Brown must have sat on the bed because it also had burn marks on the bed spread, which was also wet down by the firemen. I heard Mrs. Brown say that she was making a cup of tea at the stove and she noticed her house coat was burning, and she could not get it out so she took it off. It was apparent to me that she must have been in shock for she did not say she was in any pain. Mrs. Brown stated she made a cup of tea every night and why this happen, she shock her head and said "I don't know".

Mr. Brown was sitting on a chair in the living room and when firemen and I asked him to come out side to get out of the smoke, Mrs. Brown said he really can't walk. I spoke to Mr. Brown and asked if he needed help getting up and he said no that he will wait for "Milly" (Mrs. Brown) to help him. I told him she was going to take a ride to the hospital to have her burns checked and he said it was ok he would wait. At this time a neighbor walked into the house and asked if she could help that she knew the family well, Mr Brown seemed very comfortable with Mrs. Elliot so I said ok. Mrs. Elliot said that Mr. Brown really has a very hard time getting around and that she would stay with him till the family arrived, she also called other Brown family members for Mr. Brown.

Mr. and Mrs. Brown were alone in the house at the time of the fire and Mr. Brown was not healthy enough to get around the house well. The fact that Mrs. Brown was able to talk to myself and other medics with out difficulty and she herself stated she was alone in the kitchen when this happened, I have no reason to believe that any further investigation would be required.

On 2-28-05 when I stopped by the Police station on my time off, I was informed by Sgt. Poliquin that Mrs. Brown had past away, possible from the injuries she received in the fire.

Per protocol, I called Matt Bolden's Office, (States Attny. Office) and left a message about the case and asked that he call me.

Tuesday 3-1-05 upon arrival to work, I was told by Detective Matt Carl that he received a call from the states Attny, Office and that if I did not feel there was any foul play that it was not required to report it to them.
